



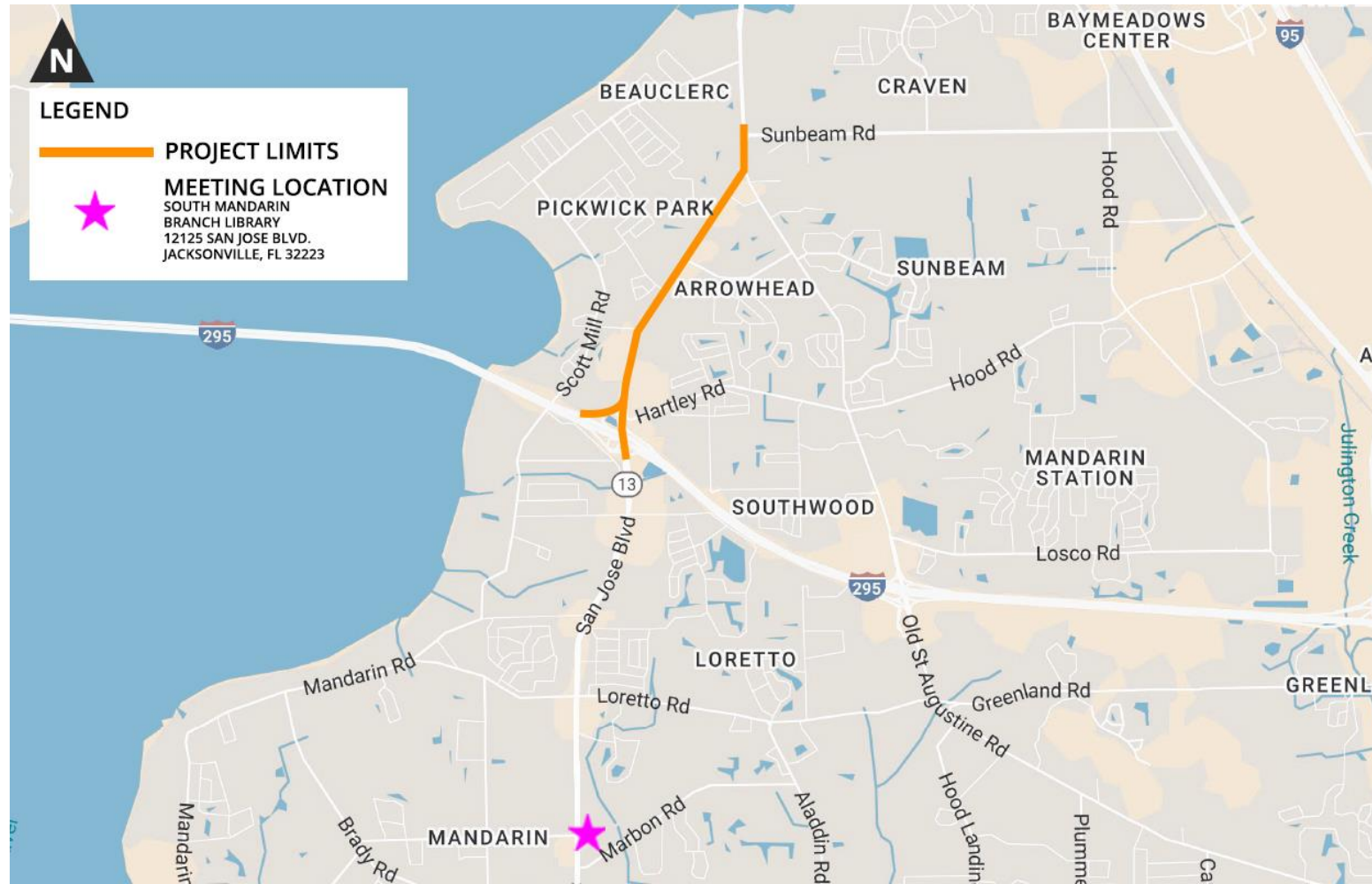

This project consists of:

- Resurfacing San Jose Boulevard (State Road 13) from north of Sunbeam Road to south of I-295
- Interchange improvements at I-295 and San Jose Boulevard

Project Start: September 2024

Estimated Completion: Early 2026

Project Cost: \$16.8 million

Contractor: Watson Civil Construction

Project Improvements

- Project improvements under FIN 445426-1 include milling and resurfacing, base work, drainage improvements, curb and gutters, traffic signals, lighting, highway signing, sidewalks/bicycle path, green-colored bicycle pavement markings, ITS and other incidental construction on San Jose Boulevard (SR 13) from south of I-295 to north of Sunbeam Road.
- Project improvements under FIN 437728-4 include widening and reconstruction of the ramp from San Jose Boulevard to I-295 North.

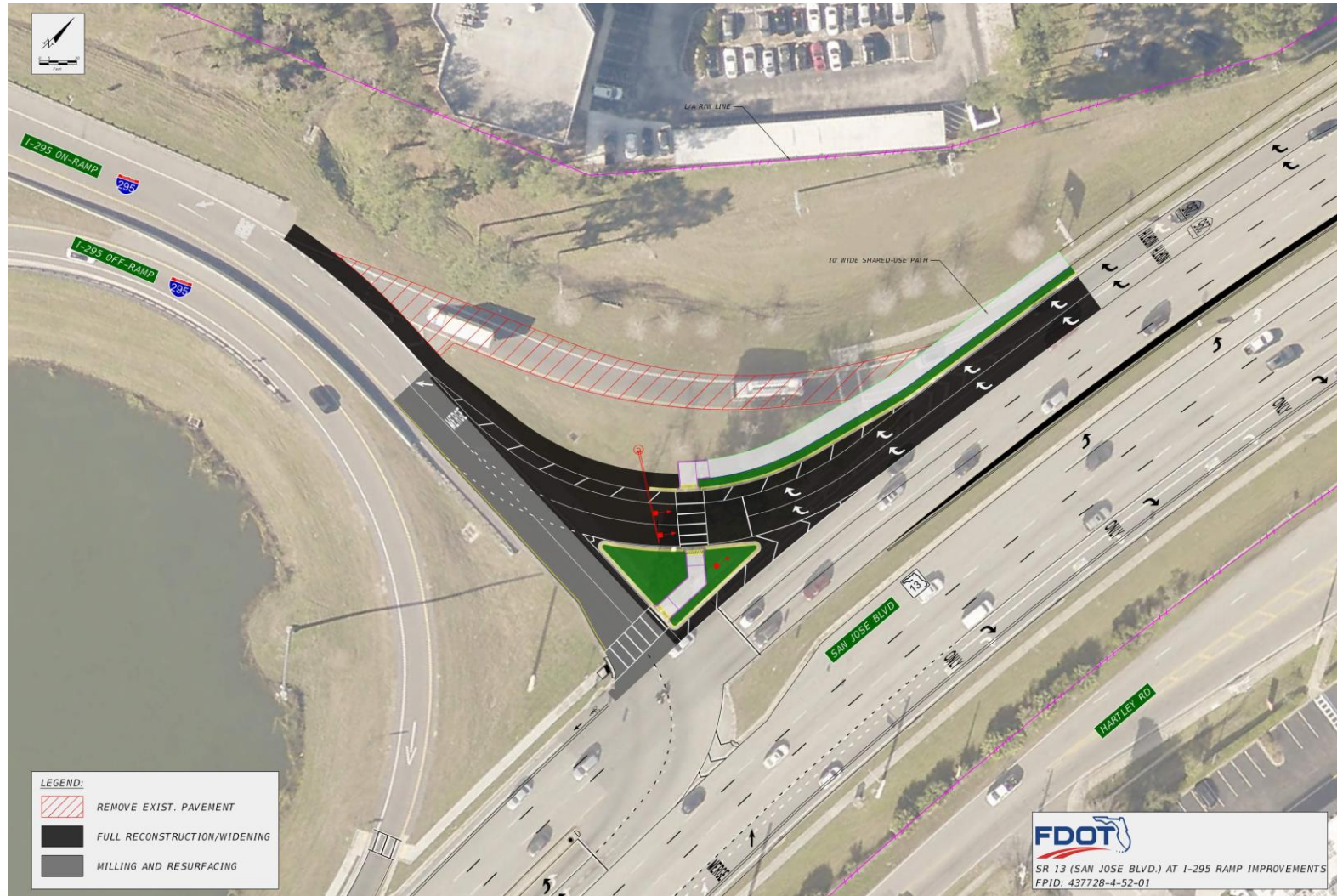
